

Recommended Native Tree Species for New Developments in Eagleswood Township

Alternate Leaved Dogwood “ <i>Cornus alternifolia</i> ”	--- 15-25 ft high, equal in spread.
American Holly “ <i>Ilex opaca</i> ”	----- 40-50 ft high, 18-40ft wide.
American Hophornbeam “ <i>Ostrya virginiana</i> ”	----- 25-40 ft high, 20-40ft wide.
American Hornbeam “ <i>Carpinus caroliniana</i> ”	----- 20-30 ft high and wide.
American Redbud “ <i>Cercis Canadensis</i> ”	----- 20-30 ft high, 25-35ft wide.
American Sycamore “ <i>Platinus occidentalis</i> ”	----- 75-100 ft high, equal in spread.
Blackgum “ <i>Nyssa sylvatica</i> ”	----- 30-50 ft high, 20-30 ft wide.
Eastern Red Cedar “ <i>Juniperus virginiana</i> ”	----- 40-50 ft high, 8-20 ft wide.
Flowering Dogwood “ <i>Cornus florida</i> ”	----- 20 ft high and wide.
Pin Oak “ <i>Quercus palustis</i> ”	----- 60-70 ft high, 25-40 ft wide.
Red Maple “ <i>Acer rubrum</i> ”	----- 40-60 ft high, variable spread.
Red Oak “ <i>Quercus rubra</i> ”	----- 60-75 ft high and wide.
River Birch, Heritage “ <i>Betula nigra</i> ”	----- 40-70 ft high, 40-60 ft wide.
Sassafras “ <i>Sassafras albidum</i> ”	----- 30-60 ft high, 25-40 ft wide.
Scarlet Oak “ <i>Quercus coccinea</i> ”	----- 70-75 ft high, 40-50ft wide.
Serviceberry “ <i>Amelanchier arborea</i> ”	----- 15-25 ft high, variable spread.
Sourwood “ <i>Oxydendrum arboretum</i> ”	----- 25-30 ft high, 20 ft wide.
Sweetbay Magnolia “ <i>Magnolia virginian</i> ”	----- 10-20 ft high and wide.
Tuliptree “ <i>Liriodendron</i> ”	----- 70-90 ft high, 35-50 ft wide.
White Oak “ <i>Quercus alba</i> ”	----- 50-80 ft high and wide.
Yellow Birch “ <i>Betula alleghaniensis</i> ”	----- 60-75 ft high and wide.
